The Story of St. Patrick's Day

The celebration on March 17 started in 1631 when a Feast Day was established to honor St. Patrick. He had been Patron Saint of Ireland who had died around the fifth century—12 centuries before the modern version of the holiday was observed.

It's said that St. Patrick was born Maewyn Succat, but that he later changed his name to Patricius (or Patrick), which derives from the Latin term for “father figure,” after he became a priest. That supposed luck of his is the root of all the themed merchandise for modern St. Patrick's Day.

Up until 150 B.C., March was the first month of the year! There are still traces of this old system in our modern calendar. According to the oldest Roman calendars, one year was 10 months long, beginning in March and ending in December. December was the 10th month as it was named for the number 10 in Latin (decem), and September was named for seven (septem). January and February were the exceptions as they were two nameless months called "winter".
